Scripture: Matthew 12:1-14

Message: The Lord of the Sabbath

1. What man-made rules/traditions do you see in the church today that threaten to burden us down? What ways do we judge others by such rules?
2. Jesus challenged the Pharisees lack of understanding of the word of God with the statements, "Have you never read" (3) and "If you had understood what it means" (7). In what ways are we
3. Jesus' two Scriptural arguments show that it is right to set aside some laws (particularly ceremonial ones) in order to save or sustain life. How would we know when we can do this today? What kinds of NT commands may need to be set aside in certain cases?
4. Jesus quoted Hosea 6:6 to the Pharisees which says, "I desire mercy not sacrifice." Why did Jesus say this to the Pharisees? Look at the following passages to as you think on this and to see the emphasis God places on love and mercy in our obedience to him: Isaiah 58:1-7; Matthew 5:7; Matthew 9:9-13; 15:1-9; 1 Cor. 13:1-3. How does this apply in our lives?
5. Jesus said, "the Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath?" How does this truth apply to other commands in the Word and why is it important to understand this for our daily walk with him?
6. What have you learned about the Lord through these verses? Do you have any other questions about this passage or the message preached?
